

## NOTES

- 1 **ABBERLEY** Abberley was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 2 **ABBOTSMORTON** The earliest register seems to be 1728 though the bishops transcripts date back to 1611.
- 3 **ACTON BEAUCHAMP** Acton Beauchamp was transferred from Worcestershire to Herefordshire in 1897 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Hereford in 1919. The original registers are at Hereford Record Office.
- 4 **ALDERMINSTER** Alderminster was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931. Originals are at Warwickshire Record Office. A transcript of marriages 1613-1812 is available on the bookshelves.
- 5 **ALFRICK** Volume one is a joint register with Lulsley. Suckley parish registers also include some entries relating to this parish.
- 6 **ALSTONE** Alstone is in Gloucestershire, but was a chapelry of Overbury. Its registers include entries for Little Washbourne and Teddington.
- 7 **AMBLECOTE** Amblecote parish was formed in 1842 from Old Swinford. It was in Staffordshire, and is now in the West Midlands. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 8 **ASHTON UNDER HILL** Ashton under Hill was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931. It is in Gloucester Diocese.
- 9 **ASTON SOMERVILLE** Aston Somerville was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931. It is in Gloucester Diocese. A fire at the church caused considerable damage to the parish registers.
- 10 **ASTWOOD BANK** The church was a chapel of ease to Feckenham. A parish of Astwood Bank with Crabbs Cross was formed c1950. Astwood became a separate parish in 1981.
- 11 **BALSALL HEATH** Balsall Heath was formed in 1855 from Kings Norton. The original registers are at Birmingham Record Office.
- 12 **BARNT GREEN** Barnt Green parish was formed from The Lickey in 1922. It is in the County of Hereford and Worcester, but the Diocese of Birmingham. Some original registers are still at the church. Marriages 1920-69 have been deposited.
- 13 **BATCHLEY  
ST DAVID** Batchley St Davids comes under Redditch St Stephen. Its registers were filmed with Redditch St Stephen registers.

- 14 **BAYTON** Bayton was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 15 **BECKFORD** Beckford was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931. It is in the Diocese of Gloucester.
- 16 **BEWDLEY** Bewdley was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire in 1844 and from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919. Before 1853 entries for Bewdley are in Ribbesford register.
- 17 **BIRCHEN COPPICE** The original registers are still at the church.
- 18 **BISHOPS WOOD** Bishops Wood was a Chapel of Ease to Hartlebury. A building was licensed for service in 1882. In 1974 the title of the parish became Hartlebury with Bishops Wood. It later reverted to just Hartlebury. The original registers are still at the church.
- 19 **BISHOPTON** Bishopton is in Warwickshire. It was a chapelry of old Stratford.
- 20 **BLAKEDOWN** Blakedown was formerly in the parish of Hagley. It was transferred to Churchill in Halfshire in 1888.
- 21 **BLOCKLEY** In 1931 Blockley was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire. The original registers are at Gloucester Record Office. A transcript of some of the earlier registers is available on the bookshelves.
- 22 **BOCKLETON** Bockleton was in the County of Worcester prior to local government reorganisation in 1974, but in the Diocese of Hereford. The registers are said to include entries for Hampton Charles.
- 23 **BORDESLEY** Bordesley came under Tardebigge.
- 24 **BRADLEY** Bradley was formerly a chapelry annexed to Fladbury. A parish was formed with Stock in 1866 and is known as Stock and Bradley.
- 25 **BRANSFORD** The Chapelry of Bransford is annexed to Leigh. Bransford registers begin in 1767 and were filmed with Leigh.
- 26 **BREDICOT** Bredicot was annexed to Tibberton.
- 27 **BREDON'S NORTON** This parish is also known as Norton by Bredon and was a chapel of ease to Bredon.

- 28 BRICKLEHAMPTON  
Bricklehampton was a chapelry annexed to Elmley Castle.
- 29 BROADHEATH  
Broadheath parish was formed in 1910 from Hallow, Wichenford and Worcester St John in Bedwardine. Some baptisms pre 1958 are said to have been entered at Hallow.
- 30 BROADWATERS  
Some entries are recorded in Wolverley parish registers.
- 31 BROMSGROVE  
ALL SAINTS  
All Saints parish was formed in 1875.
- 32 BROMSGROVE  
ST JOHNS  
The Marriage register for 1754-1776 is missing.
- 33 BROOME  
Broome was transferred from Staffordshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
- 34 CATSHILL  
Catshill parish was formed in 1844 out of Bromsgrove.
- 35 CHACELEY  
Chaceley was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931. The original registers are at Gloucester Record Office.
- 36 CHARLTON  
Charlton parish was formed in 1882 from Cropthorne.
- 37 CHILDSWICKHAM  
Childswickham was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931. It is in Gloucester Diocese.
- 38 CHURCH HONEYBOURNE  
Church Honeybourne was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Gloucester in 1919.
- 39 CHURCHILL WITH  
BLAKEDOWN  
40 CLAINES  
Churchill is also known as Churchill in Halfshire.
- 41 CLENT  
Claintes parish originally covered a large portion of Worcester City.
- 42 COFTON HACKETT  
Clent was transferred from Staffordshire to Worcester in 1844.
- 43 COOKHILL  
Cofton Hackett is in the County of Hereford and Worcester. It was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1919.
- 44 COOKLEY  
Cookhill was a chapel of ease to Inkberrow. The original registers are still at the Church.
- 45 COTTERIDGE  
Cookley parish was formed in 1849 from Kidderminster Foreign and Wolverely.
- 45 COTTERIDGE  
Cotteridge is in Birmingham Diocese. It was formed in 1916 from Kings Norton.

- 46 COW HONEYBOURNE This parish was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931. There was a church, but the parishoners mainly attended the Church of Honeybourne and the register is included in that of Church Honeybourne.
- 46 COWLEIGH Cowleigh parish was created in 1876 from Mathon St James/West Malvern, Leigh and Cradley.
- 48 CRABBS CROSS Crabbs Cross was a Mission Church licensed in 1896, and came within Feckenham. A parish of Astwood Bank with Crabbs Cross was formed c1950. Crabbs Cross now forms part of the parish of Redditch.
- 49 CRADLEY Cradley parish was formed in 1799 from Halesowen. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 50 CROWN EAST Baptisms pre 1882 were recorded at Worcester St John. A building was licensed for divine service in 1876 and came within St Johns.
- 51 CUTSDEAN Cutsdean was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Gloucester in 1912 and from Worcestershre to Gloucestershire in 1931. The original registers are held at Gloucester Record Office.
- 52 DAYLESFORD Daylesford was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Oxford in 1919 and from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931. A transcript of some early registers is available on the bookshelves.
- 53 DODFORD Dodford parish was formed in 1908 from Bromsgrove and Catshill. The original registers are at the church.
- 54 DORMSTON Earlier registers are said to be missing. Bishops transcripts date back to 1607. Some burials are said to have been conducted at Inkberrow.
- 55 DOWLES Dowles was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershre in 1895 and from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 56 DRAKES BROUGHTON Drakes Broughton is a chapelry of Stoulton.
- 57 DROITWICH  
ST NICHOLAS There appear to be no Droitwich St Nicholas registers prior to 1870 though the bishops transcripts go back to 1611.
- 58 DUDLEY  
ST AUGUSTINE  
HOLLY HALL The parish was formed in 1884 from Dudley St Thomas. The original registers are held at Dudley Record Office.

- 59 DUDLEY ST EDMUND The church was demolished in 1646 during the Civil War. Between 1646 and 1843 there were joint registers with Dudley St Thomas. The church was rebuilt in 1724 but was a Chapel of Ease to St Thomas's. It did not become a separate parish until 1844. The original registers are held at Dudley Record Office.
- 60 DUDLEY ST FRANCIS The parish was formed from Dudley St Edmund in 1935. The original registers are held at Dudley Record Office.
- 61 DUDLEY ST JAMES This parish was formed in 1844 from Dudley St Thomas. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 62 DUDLEY ST JOHN This parish is known as Kates Hill. It was formed in 1844 from Dudley St Thomas. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 63 DUDLEY ST LUKE This parish was formed in 1876 from Dudley St Thomas. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 64 DUDLEY ST THOMAS From 1646 to 1843 there were joint registers with Dudley St Edmund. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 65 EASTHAM Eastham was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 66 ECKINGTON 1678 is the earliest extant register. The Bishops transcripts date back to 1612.
- 67 EDVIN LOACH This parish was transferred in 1893 from Worcestershire to Herefordshre. The original registers are at Hereford Record Office.
- 68 ELDERSFIELD The earliest register has been missing for many years. The bishops transcripts date back to 1611.
- 69 EVENLODE Evenlode was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Gloucester in 1919 and from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931. The original registers are at Gloucester Record Office.
- 70 EVESHAM ST LAWRENCE Marriages 1754-1837 are included in the register for Evesham All Saints. The original registers are still at the church.
- 71 FAIRFIELD Fairfield was a chapel of ease to Belbroughton.
- 72 FAIRFIELD ST RICHARD Fairfield St Richard is a conventional district. Its records are with those of Hampton.
- 73 FAR FOREST Far Forest was formed in 1844 from Ribbesford, Rock and Stottesdon, Salop. It was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester 1919.

- 74 **FINSTALL** Finstall was formed out of Stoke Prior parish in 1868.
- 75 **FLADBURY** The Fladbury registers may also include entries for Hill and Moor, Throckmorton and Wyre Piddle. There are also separate registers for these parishes so confusion can arise.
- 76 **FRANCHE** Franche was a chapel of ease to Kidderminster St Mary.
- 77 **FRANKLEY** Frankley is in the County of Hereford and Worcester, but it was transferred to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905.
- 78 **GUARLFORD** Guarlford was formed in 1866 out of Great Malvern and Madresfield. The original registers are still at the church.
- 79 **HALESOWEN** Halesowen was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 80 **HANBURY** The registers of baptisms 1958 onwards, marriages 1958 onwards and burials 1897 onwards were stolen in 1962. A copy was made of the marriage register 1958-62. Baptism entries for 1958-77 have been made in volume 2 of the parish registers.
- 81 **HANLEY CHILD** Hanley Child was a chapel of ease to Eastham. It became a separate parish in 1909. It was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 82 **HANLEY SWAN** Hanley Swan was a chapel of ease to Hanley Castle.
- 84 **HANLEY WILLIAM** Hanley William was a chapel of ease to Eastham. It became a separate parish in 1909. It was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 84 **HASBURY** Hasbury was formed from Halesowen. The original registers at Dudley Record Office.
- 85 **HEADLESS CROSS** Headless Cross was formed from Ipsley, Tardebigge and Feckenham.
- 86 **HEIGHTINGTON** Heightington was a chapelry of Rock. It was transferred from the diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester 1919.
- 87 **HILL CROOME** The registers before 1721 are missing. The bishops transcripts date back to 1607.

- 88 HINTON ON THE GREEN Hinton on the Green was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931 and from the Diocese of Gloucester to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 89 HOLLY BUSH Holly Bush was formed in 1912 from Berrow, Castlemorton, Eastnor and Ledbury.
- 90 HOLT The registers of burials are said to include entries for Little Witley.
- 91 HOOK COMMON Hook Common came within Upton on Severn prior to 1870.
- 92 ICCOMB Iccomb was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1844 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Gloucester in 1912.
- 93 INKBERROW The registers are said to included burials for Kington and Dormston.
- 94 IPSLEY Ipsley was transferred from Warwickshire to Worcestershire in 1931. The registers were damaged when the church safe was broken into.
- 95 KEMERTON Kemerton is in the Diocese of Gloucester, but was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
- 96 KEMPSEY Marriages 1896-1906 are missing.
- 97 KIDDERMINSTER FOLEY PARK (HOLY INNOCENTS) Kidderminster Foley Park was formed in 1936 from Kidderminster St John Baptist.
- 98 KIDDERMINSTER FRANCHE Kidderminster Franche was a chapel of ease to Kidderminster St Mary.
- 99 KIDDERMINSTER ST ANDREW MISSION CHURCH This church was attached to Kidderminster St George.
- 100 KIDDERMINSTER ST GEORGE Kidderminster St George was created in 1867 from Kidderminster St Mary.
- 101 KIDDERMINSTER ST JAMES Kidderminster St James was originally a mission church connected to Kidderminster St Mary. It was closed in 1977. The original registers are at Kidderminster St Mary's church.
- 102 KIDDERMINSTER ST JOHN BAPTIST Kidderminster St John Baptist was formed in 1807 from Kidderminster St Mary.

- 103 KIDDERMINSTER  
ST MARY This church also seems to have been known as Kidderminster St Mary and All Saints.
- 104 KIDDERMINSTER TRIMPLEY Trimpley was a chapel of ease to Kidderminster St Mary.
- 105 KINGS HEATH Kings Heath was formed in 1863 from Kings Norton. The original registers are at Birmingham Record Office.
- 106 KINGS NORTON Kings Norton was a chapel of ease to Bromsgrove until 1846. At one time it included Moseley, Balsall Heath, Kings Heath, Stirchley, Cotteridge and West Heath. In 1911 the parish was transferred to Birmingham. It was transferred to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905. A transcript of the earlier registers is available on the open shelves in lieu of a microfilm.
- 107 KINGS NORTON  
CHURCH OF  
EPIPTHANY This church covered the Longbridge estate. After 1938 baptisms were entered in the Kings Norton register.
- 108 KNIGHTON-ON- TEME Knighton-on-Teme was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 109 KYRE WYARD Kyre Wyard was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 110 LANGLEY Langley was formed in 1846 from Halesowen. It was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905. The registers are held at Smethwick Library.
- 111 LEIGH WITH  
BRANSFORD Leigh parish registers commence in 1538 Bransford in 1767. The two parishes were not separated out for microfilming purposes.
- 112 LEYSTERS Leysters is in the Diocese of Hereford.
- 113 LICKEY Lickey was formed in 1856 from portions of Bromsgrove and Kings Norton. It was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905.
- 114 LINDRIDGE Lindridge was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 115 LITTLE MALVERN 1691 seems to be the earliest extant register. The bishops transcripts date back to 1615.
- 116 LITTLE WASHBOURNE Little Washbourne is a chapelry of Overbury and is in Gloucestershire. For entries prior to 1813 see Alstone.
- 117 LITTLE WITLEY 1680 seems to be the earliest extant register. The bishops transcripts date back to 1621.

- 118 LOWER SAPEY Lower Sapey was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919. Pre 1878 Parishioners of Lower Sapey had the right to be buried at Clifton upon Teme as there was no burial ground at Lower Sapey.
- 119 LULSLEY Vol 1 is a joint register with Alfrick. Lulsley is a Chapelry of Alfrick. It was a Chapelry of Suckley until 1912. The registers were filmed with those of Alfrick.
- 120 LYE Lye was formed in 1843 from Old Swinford.
- 121 MALVERN  
ALL SAINTS  
THE WYCHE Malvern All Saints the Wyche was formed in 1926. It was a chapel of ease to Great Malvern. The original registers are still at the church.
- 122 MALVERN CHRISTCHURCH Malvern Christchurch was formed in 1872 from Great Malvern.
- 123 MALVERN  
HOLY TRINITY Malvern Holy Trinity was formed in 1869 from Great Malvern.
- 124 MALVERN  
ST ANDREW Malvern St Andrew became a separate parish in 1976. It was previously part of Malvern Christchurch.
- 125 MALVERN LINK Malvern Link was formed in 1846 from Leigh.
- 126 MALVERN WELLS Malvern Wells was formed in 1836 from Hanley Castle. Some original registers are still at the church. Marriages 1859-1993 have been deposited.
- 127 MAMBLE Mamble was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919. Entries for the period 1590-1741 are to be found in the Bayton register.
- 128 MATHON Mathon was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Hereford in 1905. Malvern St James was created in 1844 from Mathon, Leigh, Cradley and Colwall. It was later called West Malvern. The originals are at Hereford Record Office.
- 129 MOOR Some entries for Moor are included in Fladbury parish registers. It is not always possible to distinguish clearly those for Moor, especially for marriages.
- 130 MOSELEY Moseley was created in 1761 from Bromsgrove but was included in Kings Norton. It was refounded in 1853 from Kings Norton and Yardley. Moseley St Anne was created in 1875 from Moseley St Mary and Moseley St Agnes in 1914 from Moseley St Mary and Yardley Wood.
- 131 NETHERTON Netherton parish was formed in 1814 from Dudley. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.



- 144 **REDDITCH  
ST STEPHEN** Redditch St Stephen was a chapelry of Tardebigge. There is a gap in the burial registers for the period 1906-1967.
- 145 **REDMARLEY D'ABITOT** Redmarley D'Abitot was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Gloucester in 1977.
- 146 **RIBBESFORD** Ribbesford was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919. The registers include entries for Bewdley prior to 1853.
- 147 **ROCHFORD** Rochford was transferred from Herefordshire to Worcestershire in 1844 and from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 148 **ROCK** Rock was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 149 **ROMSLEY** The registers prior to 1736 have been destroyed. Romsley parish was formed in 1841 out of Halesowen.
- 150 **ROWLEY REGIS** Rowley Regis was transferred from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905. The original registers are at West Bromwich Library.
- 151 **RUBERY** Rubery was formed in 1933 from the Lickey.
- 152 **SHELSLEY WALSH** Shelsley Walsh was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1905.
- 153 **SHIPSTON ON  
STOUR** Shipston on Stour was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931. It became part of the Diocese of Coventry in 1918. The originals are at Warwick Record Office. A transcript covering marriages 1572-1812 is available on the bookshelves.
- 154 **SPETCHLEY** Spetchley church is now redundant.
- 155 **STAMBERMILL** Stambermill was formed in 1873 from Lye, Stourbridge and Old Swinford. The originals are at Dudley Record Office.
- 156 **STANFORD ON  
TEME** Stanford was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
- 157 **STAUNTON** Staunton was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
- 158 **STIRCHLEY** Stirchley was formed in 1912 from Kings Norton and Moseley.

159	<b>STOCKTON ON TEME</b>	Stockton on Teme was transferred from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
160	<b>STOKE BLISS</b>	Stoke Bliss was transferred from Herefordshire to Worcestershire in 1897 and from the Diocese of Hereford to the Diocese of Worcester in 1919.
161	<b>STOURBRIDGE ST JOHN</b>	Stourbridge St John was formed in 1862. Until c1860 it was known as St Peter. It is a chapel of ease to Old Swinford.
162	<b>STOURBRIDGE ST THOMAS</b>	Stourbridge St Thomas was formed in 1866 from Old Swinford.
163	<b>STOURPORT ON SEVERN</b>	Lower Mitton was once a chapelry of Kidderminster. It became a parish in its own right in 1844. It has been known variously as Mitton, Lower Mitton and Stourport on Severn.
164	<b>SUCKLEY</b>	The parish registers included entries for Alfrick and Lulsley for the period 1695 to 1732.
165	<b>TEDDINGTON</b>	Teddington was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
166	<b>TENBURY ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS</b>	This parish was originally known as Old Wood and was formed from Tenbury Wells, Laysters and Middleton on the Hill. Tenbury St Michael is in the Diocese of Hereford.
167	<b>TENBURY WELLS</b>	Tenbury Wells is in the Diocese of Hereford.
168	<b>THROCKMORTON</b>	Some entries were made both in Throckmorton and Fladbury parish registers. Burials took place at Fladbury.
169	<b>TIBBERTON</b>	The register of general entries 1680-1760 is missing.
170	<b>TIDMINGTON</b>	Tidmington was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Coventry in 1918. The originals are at Warwick Record Office. A transcript covering marriages 1693-1812 is available on the bookshelves.
171	<b>TREDINGTON</b>	Tredington was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Coventry in 1918. The originals are at Warwick Record Office.

- 172 UPPER ARLEY Upper Arley was transferred from the Diocese of Lichfield to the Diocese of Worcester in 1905.
- 173 WARNDON ST WULSTAN Warndon St Wulstan was formed in 1966 from Worcester Rainbow Hill, Hindlip and Warndon. The original registers are at Warndon St Michaels Church.
- 174 WEBHEATH Webheath was formed from Tardebigge.
- 175 WEST HAGLEY West Hagley was formed from Hagley. It was licensed for Divine service in 1909. The original registers are at the church.
- 176 WEST HEATH West Heath was formed in 1966 from Kings Norton, Northfield, Longbridge and Cofton Hackett.
- 177 WEST MALVERN West Malvern was formed from Leigh, Cradley, Colwall and Mathon in 1844. It was formerly a chapelry of Mathon.
- 178 WICHENFORD The earliest extant register dates back to 1690. Bishops transcripts date back to 1613. There is a transcript of the register for 1599-1690.
- 179 WICK Wick was a chapelry to Pershore St Andrew and became a separate parish in 1727. The earliest extant register dates back to 1695. Bishops transcripts date back to 1608.
- 180 WILDEN Wilden was formed in 1904 from Hartlebury, Kidderminster Foreign and Upper and Lower Mitton.
- 181 WOLLASTON Wollaston was formed in 1860 from Amblecote. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 182 WOLLESCOTE Wollescote was formed in 1965 from Lye, Stanbermill, Old Swinford and Pedmore. The original registers are at Dudley Record Office.
- 183 WOOLHOPE Woolhope was in the County of Hereford and Worcester and the Diocese of Hereford.
- 184 WORCESTER DINES GREEN Worcester Dines Green was created a conventional district in 1967. It became a parish c1967. It now appears to be called Worcester St Michael. The original registers are still at the church.

- 185 **WORCESTER  
HOLY TRINITY  
AND ST MATTHEW** Worcester Holy Trinity was formed in 1866 from Claines and Worcester St Martin. The church was demolished in 1969. In 1952 the Conventional District of Ronkswood with the Mission Church of St Matthew was formed. This ultimately became the parish church of Worcester Holy Trinity, the Mission Church being replaced in 1965 by the current church dedicated to Holy Trinity and St Matthew.
- 186 **WORCESTER  
ST BARNABAS** This parish was also known as Rainbow Hill. It was formed in 1883 from Claines.
- 187 **WORCESTER  
ST GEORGE** This parish was also known as Claines St George. It was a chapelry of Claines from 1830-1862. It was formed in 1862 from Claines parish into a separate parish.
- 188 **WORCESTER  
ST HELENS** Worcester St Helens is redundant. It is currently used as a branch of the Hereford and Worcester Record Office.
- 189 **WORCESTER  
ST MARK IN THE  
CHERRY ORCHARD** Worcester St Mark was formed in 1955 from Worcester St Peter. It had previously been a conventional district. The original registers are still at the church.
- 190 **WORCESTER  
ST MARTIN IN THE  
CORNMARKET** Worcester St Martin in the Cornmarket was known as Worcester St Swithun, Old St Martin and was a chapel of ease to Worcester St Swithun. It became the parish church c1978 after the closure of St Swithun. The originals are still with the parish office.
- 191 **WORCESTER  
ST MARY** This parish was also known as Worcester the Tything. It was formed in 1875 from Claines. It has now been converted to housing.
- 192 **WORCESTER  
ST MICHAEL** Worcester St Michael has been demolished.
- 193 **WORCESTER  
ST OSWALDS** Worcester St Oswalds was a chapel attached to St Oswalds Hospital.
- 194 **WORCESTER  
ST PAUL** Worcester St Paul was formed in 1844 from Worcester St Peter and the Blockhouse, which was formerly extra-parochial.
- 195 **WORCESTER  
ST PETER** Worcester St Peter was closed in 1972 and demolished.
- 196 **WORCESTER  
ST STEPHEN** This parish was also known as Barbourne. It was formed in 1862 from Claines.

197	<b>WORCESTER ST SWITHUN</b>		<b>Worcester St Swithun was formerly a parish in its own right, having a chapel of ease known as Worcester Old St Martin to distinguish it from Worcester St Martin in the London Road. It ceased to be a parish in 1978. The parish then became Worcester St Martin in the Cornmarket.</b>
198	<b>WORCESTER CHRISTCHURCH</b>	<b>TOLLADINE,</b>	<b>Worcester Tolladine Christchurch was formed in 1952 from Worcester St Barnabas and Worcester Holy Trinity.</b>
199	<b>WRIBBENHALL</b>		<b>Wribbenhall was formed in 1844 from Kidderminster.</b>
200	<b>WYCHBOLD</b>		<b>Wychbold was formed in 1888 from Dodderhill.</b>
201	<b>WYRE PIDDLE</b>		<b>Some entries are included in Fladbury registers.</b>
202	<b>WYTHALL</b>		<b>Wythall is in the County of Hereford and Worcester, but the Diocese of Birmingham. It was formed in 1758 from Bromsgrove. It was a chapelry of Kings Norton until 1853. Baptisms 1770-1812 are said to be included in King's Norton register.</b>
203	<b>YARDLEY</b>		<b>Yardley was transferred from Worcestershire to Birmingham in 1911 and from the Diocese of Worcester to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1905. The original registers are at Birmingham Record Office.</b>
