Q9: Sources of data

In Worcestershire forecasting is undertaken centrally by the LEA using a database of pupil and known children data for January in the relevant year. Data is obtained from two prime sources: -

i) Pre-school age children

We use known children data in our forecasts supplied annually by the Child Health Departments. The data is analysed and allocated to school catchment areas. Known children are those known to be living at a particular address on 31st August each year. We have found this data to be far more robust than the use of birth data.

ii) Children of School age

Actual data from January Form 7 Census.

Q10: How the raw data are processed to arrive at final figures

Information on any adjustment factors used together with a brief description of how these have been derived e.g. wastage rates from year group cohorts and post-16 staying-on rates - what rates have been applied? Over how many years have the data been built up? What assumptions underlie the figures?

We use a methodology of trend analysis for forecasting based on data for the past 5 years. Actual intakes at 4+ are compared to known children within the catchment area for each school, the average percentage intakes are then applied to known children for future years. The pattern of transfer between age groups within a school and between schools on transfer is analysed to determine regular or unusual trends.

Each school's forecast is then individually assessed to determine whether the average pattern reflects what we consider will happen to intakes and year on year age transfers.

The system provides great flexibility to carry out 'what if' calculations using a range of assumptions and can be used to provide a series of scenarios for Head Teachers and Governors to enable them to determine potential demographic and budget implications. It also provides advance warning of potentially significant increases and reductions in intakes, which can be crucial to the future organisation of the school and/or area.

Q11: Additional factors allowed for

e.g. housing developments; boundary changes; expected migration; rationalisation proposals; age of transfer changes; error margins. In each case the amount should be quantified, even if only an estimate, and the rationale for such allowances outlined.

Forecasts are adjusted as appropriate with information about housing developments from the District Council for larger developments. Until final housing numbers are agreed and phasing of development is established, additional information is provided in the narrative that supports the forecasts.

Some schools close to the County border can be affected by in and out migration. However, using the 5 year average transfer rates a trend can be established. Neighbouring LEAs keep us informed of schools opening/ closing/ changing admission numbers so that we can use different transfer rates until a new trend has emerged.

Where changes are agreed to catchment areas or age of transfer, adjustments are made to the forecasting model.

Q14: Commentary

Justifications for Surplus > 25% and >30 Places

The County picture is one of a declining roll as smaller year groups start to come through from Reception. In areas where there is significant housing growth, this trend will be offset. The LEA is aware of large housing developments ongoing and planned in Bromsgrove and Malvern.

1. Schools with surplus places in the Wyre Forest Area

The following schools are in the Wyre Forest area of Worcestershire. An Area Review has just finished. A decision was taken by the County Council Cabinet to move from a three tier to a two tier system, with one age of transfer at 11, with effect from 1 September 2007. SOC has yet to make a final decision. As part of this Review the Authority has taken a pro-active approach in addressing the surplus place issue.

The following schools are in the Redditch area of Worcestershire. The Redditch area was reviewed in 1998/1999. There has been a period of implementation which has now been concluded with the final building works being completed summer 2003. The Authority acknowledges that the issue of surplus places remains in some parts of Redditch and an evaluation of the review is in progress with further recommendations to cabinet expected in September 2004.

3. Schools not involved in area reviews

Bromsgrove, Linthurst First(2022)

The LEA is aware of the situation at this school and has spoken with the Governing Body with a view to federation or merger with another local school. In the short term a double mobile classroom unit has remained on site which has enabled the school to reorganise the internal accommodation and release two classrooms in the main school for the purpose of a hall. There are on going discussions with the school on the future of the provision required. A revised net capacity of 100 is achievable. As from 1st September 2004 the school will be known as Blackwell First School.

Droitwich, Westlands First(2035)

This school is situated in Droitwich, which is scheduled for review in 2005/2006. Major housing development has taken place in this area but not within this schools catchment area. Issues relating to surplus places will be considered as part of the Droitwich Review of Education.

Inkberrow First(2079)

This is a 135 place 5 - 10 school serving a rural community. It is situated in the District of Pershore, which is to be reviewed in 2004/2005. Consultations as part of the review process will look at all available options to reduce the number of surplus places.

Malvern Hills Primary(2106)

This school serves a deprived estate in Malvern but there are few surplus places in schools nearby that would enable us to close it. The situation at this school is currently being reviewed in the context of growing pressure for places in Malvern due to the development of the Qinetiq site in the town.

Suckley Primary(2153)

This small rural school is situated in the District of Malvern. If the school were to close, there are no schools nearby that have capacity to take all the pupils. The situation will be reviewed at the time of the Malvern Area Review scheduled for 2007.

Worcester, Dines Green Primary(2163)

The school came out of 'special measures' just over two years ago and has been making good progress ever since. The removal of a temporary classroom has reduced the net capacity. A Sure Start provision is currently being developed on site that will remove one classroom. Two further classrooms are due to be re-designated one as a music room and another as a special needs room. This will reduce the surplus places at the school and will achieve a net capacity of 210 compared with the current published figure of 315. The work is scheduled for completion by September 2004.

Worcester, Stanley Road Primary(2179)

The LEA is aware of the falling pupil numbers in the Worcester City area. Neighbouring Redhill Primary School is being rebuilt with a reduced capacity and will have a reduced PAN with effect from 1st September 2005. Some catchment area changes are also being introduced for 2005 which should increase the catchment area of Stanley Road Primary School and subsequently raise pupil numbers.

Worcester, Elbury Mount Primary(2203)

In January 2004, the LEA decided to 'Fresh Start' this school following an Ofsted Report which placed the school in Special Measures. This received approval from the SOC in April and the school will reopen in September 2004 as 'The Fairfield Community Primary School'. Local confidence has grown with the implementation of this change and pupil numbers have risen since January 2004.

Droitwich, Westacre Middle(2916)

Major housing development has taken place to the south east of Droitwich town centre. This school is situated to the west of the town where pupil numbers have been in decline. A Review of Education provision is scheduled to take place in 2005/2006 which will examine issues such as surplus places.

Harvington CofE First School(3053)

This is a 180 place 5 - 10 First school serving a rural area in the Evesham pyramid of schools. The forecast indicates continuing falling numbers. While the Authority recognises the contribution of the school to the community it will be monitored closely as part of the Authority's policy on small schools

Upton Upon Severn CE Primary(3107)

Pupil numbers in this area of the County have been steadily falling. Discussions are taking place with the Governors of

the school to make use of the classrooms available for pre-school provision, reducing the net capacity and the surplus places.

Astley CofE Primary(3300)

As part of the recent net capacity exercise the capacity has been increased in advance of anticipated greater numbers. Forecast pupil numbers are set to increase by 15% to 83 over the next 4 years reducing surplus places.
